Project Summary:

Misaka is a small HIV/AIDS community on the outskirts of Ndola, the second largest city in Zambia. The families living here are a motley group of disenfranchised people. Infected and affected by HIV, most have little choice but to struggle day to day, hoping for enough food.

Project Details:

Our goal is to have 200 children sponsored in Misaka. The monthly support of sponsors will help take care of each child's personal needs: food, education and health care.

Pastor Bernard and his wife Medica saw the devastation HIV/AIDS was having on the families in their community. And they listened to the call of God on their lives. The most effective response is led by community-based volunteers, but without our support the volunteers have nothing to offer the families in the community.

But there are so many other opportunities for you to share your love with the community. Each volunteer sacrifices much of their day to walk alongside men, women and children who are suffering.
